

Summer break is almost here. We welcome all age appropriate children and adults to the clubhouse and amenities and want to remind you of the rules so everyone can have a safe and enjoyable summer. There is no supervision for children at the clubhouse and amenities. If you know your child requires supervision or is not age appropriate, do not leave them at the clubhouse or the amenities unattended.

We have established appropriate ages for the facilities. This updates the age section in the Rules and Regulations Blue Book. The age for the children without an adult at the clubhouse and grounds has been lowered from 12 to 10 and the age of the guardian for children 6 years and older has been lowered to 15.

Clubhouse and Grounds: (with the exception of pool and gym)

- Children 10 and over have access without an adult
- Children 6-9 must be with a parent or guardian 15 years or over
- Children 0-5 must be with a parent

Pool:

- Children 12 and over have access without an adult
- Children 6-11 must be with a parent or guardian 15 years or over and can swim
- Children 0-5 must be with a parent

Gym:

- Children 14 and over have access without an adult
- Children below the age of 14 cannot use the equipment and must be with a parent

Parents must understand that children may be approached by Stoneybrook Staff at any time to politely inquire about the child's age and the parent's location. Parents will be called when children are too young to be at the clubhouse or on the grounds. The decision to ask anyone to leave is at the discretion of the Staff, and their decision is final. After one warning, violations will be sent to compliance.

In the event of a storm, the children should come into the clubhouse and wait for a parent to pick them up, or they can use the library or movie room until the storm passes. Please help us by picking up your children when the storm is going to last more than 30 minutes. Bike riders may also take cover in the clubhouse until the storm has passed.

If you plan to allow your children to come to the clubhouse and facilities without you, please make sure the office has contact information for you in case of emergency. If the office cannot locate a parent, they will call the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office so a deputy can assist.
